Sir/Madam,

In continuation to this office Letter of Intent dated 21/02/2013, I am directed to convey the Conditional Permission of Board of Governors for Increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) course from 04(four) to 06(six) seats with prospective effect, from the academic session 2013-14 at your Institute/college u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. This permission is subject to submission of blood component license issued by the competent authority to the Council.

This Letter of Permission is subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:-

1. The applicant should provide all infrastructural facilities in terms of teaching and non-teaching staff, buildings, equipment and hospital facilities as per Medical Council of India norms.
2. I am further directed to inform that you and your institution are fully responsible to fulfill and maintain norms including the infrastructure both physical and human resource, teaching faculty and clinical material, etc. throughout the academic year, as stipulated in Postgraduate Regulation of Medical Council of India. In case false/wrong declaration or fabricated documents have been used for procuring permission of the Board of Governors for the starting/increased intake and the said misconduct is brought to notice or comes to the knowledge of Medical Council of India at any stage during the current academic year, your institution is not liable to be considered for increased intake for the next academic year and this letter of permission for the increased intake/starting is also liable to be revoked for current academic year. Besides, Medical Council of India is entitled to take all such measures against you and your college/institution as permissible under the law.
3. No student should be admitted in the above courses till the formal permission of the Board of Governors is granted.
4. The applicant should provide Bank Guarantee of required amount wherever required in favour of Secretary, Medical Council of India, New Delhi valid for three years from a nationalized/scheduled Bank as per MCI's norms against increased intake/starting of above said course. However, Bank guarantee is not applicable for Government institution.
5. It may be noted that the Letter of Permission will not be issued if Bank Guarantee for required amount from a schedule bank is not submitted in order and within time. The Bank Guarantee submitted by the institute if not in order, will be returned.
6. The college has to give an undertaking that the students admitted to this course shall be paid stipend on par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutes/Central Government Medical Institutions, in the State/Union Territory where the institution is located as required under Clause 13.3 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations.
7. Postgraduate students admitted to this course would be required to present one poster presentation to read one paper at a national/state conference and to present one research paper which should be published/accepted for publication/sent for publication during the period of his Postgraduate studies so as to make him eligible to appear at the Postgraduate
